With the increase in funding from the State of Kansas we received last year, we have seen a shift in the staffing shortage and have been able to open our doors to serve more individuals and we are positioning ourselves to continue to grow our day services. We are strategically looking at our production operations and opportunities for additional contracts that not only provide revenue for our organization but offer a variety of work options. JobLink just hit an

all-time high of people served in competitive, community jobs and it will continue to take advantage of the current job market. The financial markets have not been kind across the board but our Foundation has maintained stupendous oversight of our investments and continues to be an incredibly strong asset for us. We continue to diversify and look for ways to enhance our reserves and reduce our risks.
