For over 135 months (that's over 11 years!) in a row, there has been over 100% work availability. Our team is able to pivot seamlessly between working on cargo strap orders to fulfilling home lab kits to making poppies for the VFW to sewing protective wear for private aircraft landing gear. Consumers, sewing operators and A1 production workers all have the opportunity to work on the various lines together. On average, the consumer wage increased by \$.85 per hour due to the use of this automation. The diverse contracts secured by Cottonwood Industries continue to offer meaningful, skill-building opportunities that empower individuals to earn income while contributing to a wide range of local and regional businesses.





meaningful employment opportunities in the community. It's a powerful example of how Cottonwood helps people live fuller, more independent lives.


